## MEMBER IN FOCUS: MATI KOPPEL, ESTONIA

Mati Koppel is currently a full professor of Plant Pathology at the Estonian University of Life Sciences. He graduated from Tartu State University in Biology-Botany in 1984 and received a PhD in Plant Production from the Estonian Agricultural University in 1992. Between 1984 and 1999 he was a researcher at Jõgeva Plant Breeding Institute. Between 1999 and 2019 he was the director of Jõgeva Plant Breeding Institute/Estonian Crop Research Institute. Since 2020, he has been a researcher at the Estonian University of Life Sciences.

### How long have you been a member of NJF?

I am member of NJF since 2004. Between 2004-2012 and 2012-2019 I was involved in the section of Plant Protection. Since 2021 I'm a board member of NJF.

### What is the added value of being part of NJF?

NJF has widened my networking with other Baltic and Nordic countries. NJF's seminars and congresses are bringing together people from different research



areas creating a good possibility to make new contacts. Very important is that in addition to researchers, also advisors are involved in NJF activities. This enables to keep strong connection with the agricultural practice.

### **How do you see the future of agricultural science and NJF?**

Most important is that the agricultural sector in our region is needing studies and recommendations based on local practices and deep knowledge on local conditions. I think that NJF, as an organisation joining researchers from different agricultural disciplines, will play a vital role also in the future.

**Conference pre-announcement: NJF will organize a conference on peat and peatlands in agriculture in April 2026.**

Topics will include alternatives to peat in agriculture (e.g. alternative bedding materials for livestock and growing media for greenhouses), rewetting peatlands, new insights on climate impacts of peatlands and their alternatives and policy issues and how a just transition away from peat can be implemented and what do farmers and other stakeholders think about it and what are its implications to agriculture?

### **NEW: NJF's ABSTRACTS COMPETITION FOR YOUNG SCIENTISTS**

NJF has launched an abstract competition for young scientists. Three best abstracts will receive diploma and a small prize. The best abstract will receive free participation to the NJF congress that will be held in Tartu, Estonia in October 2026.

The rules of the competition in brief:

- 1) The competition is intended for young scientists. A young scientist is a person who has defended his or her doctoral dissertation after the previous NJF conference, i.e. in September 2022 or thereafter.
- 2) Study that the submitted abstract is based on, must be part of doctoral dissertation of a young scientist. However, if the doctoral dissertation



consists of separately published scientific articles, the abstract can be related also to an article that published before September 2022.

- 3) At least one of the authors must member of NJF. If you are not yet member, please register as a member at: <https://nordicagriculture.eu/become-a-member/>
- 4) The evaluation of abstracts will be based on the following criteria:

- Relevance of the topic for Nordic-Baltic agricultural science society.
- Innovativeness, novelty value and originality of the research
- Scientific quality of the study
- Societal impact of the study.
- Clarity of presentation.

- 5) The abstract should include the following sections: introduction, objectives, material and methods, results, conclusion. The maximum length of the abstract is 6000 characters (excluding title, authors' names and affiliations).

#### 1<sup>st</sup> NJF Nordic Baltic Symposium: Rural and agri-food sector viability, competitiveness and resilience, Seinäjoki, Finland, 15<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup> of September 2025

Agri-food sector and rural areas have a key role in ensuring a well-functioning society and in securing that everyone has access to high-quality affordable food, fiber and energy. In September NJF organized a workshop, that focused on the economic viability, resilience and crisis preparedness of Nordic-Baltic agri-food sector in turbulent times. The workshop gathered about 25 researchers and other expert to discuss about the topic from the Nordic-Baltic perspective.

The program included three invited talks from three countries, and several other interesting talks. The workshop pointed out that agriculture and rural areas in the Nordic and Baltic countries share similar challenges stemming from natural and market conditions, and that risk management, resilience and crisis preparedness is a topical issue with common interests in Nordic and Baltic countries.



#### International Conference "Challenging Intersections: Securing Sustainable Food Systems in Turbulent Times", 26-28 of May 2025, University of Helsinki, Viikki Campus
